
Parenting from the saddle

PARENTING FROM THE SADDLE, FOR MY HORSE RIDING MAMAS

I've been getting a lot of messages from Horsey Mamas.

Horsey Mamas are horse girls who've become moms somewhere along the way.

We're the ones who refused to outgrow our horse phase.

The ones who are trying to stay in a saddle despite taking on the new identity of "mom".

Fighting ourselves to validate the pursuit and validate the time and money spent on our ponies.

It's a path I've been down and it ain't for the faint of heart.

So today's message is going to be a little specific.

And it may not be for all of you. I get that.

But I'm going down this path anyway.

Because I think it matters.

Because even if you're not a Horsey Mama, you might be married to one. Or you might be a mother or father to this girl who just refuses to let her horses go even though she has kids and needs to "finally learn how to be responsible".

Or you might be someone who has a different dream. So just replace "horse" with whatever your dream is.

Anyhow - I'm going to skip straight to the punchline.

You need to do it. You need to keep riding. Or doing whatever your thing is.

You need to figure out how to retain that sacred piece of yourself amidst the madness and chaos of motherhood (or fatherhood).

And you need to do it however, whenever, and wherever it works for you.

For some of you, that's going to mean boarding your horse.

For others of you it's going to be having a horse at home.

So you can sneak out to the barn anytime you have a free moment (which ends up being a different time every day!).

For some of you it's going to be selling the fancy young horse and buying the middle aged horse that's more your speed (yes, I encouraged a special Mama to do that for herself and it's been the best decision she's ever made).

Because here's what I've learned.

It's about doing whatever YOU need to do to keep it easy for YOU.

It's about doing whatever puts you in a position to do it the most often and the most consistently.

Because when we do things consistently, we get better.

And when we get better at something, we want to do it more.

It's a good kind of vicious cycle.

We surprise ourselves with what our bodies are capable of.

We surprise ourselves with the freedom found when the wind is at our backs.

We believe in ourselves.

And then we become EMPOWERED.

And when we're empowered WOMEN - then who knows what's possible?

But I think it's a LOT.

So if you're trying to figure this thing out, please feel free to reach out.

I have done a lot of soul-searching and a lot of self reflection to get to a place of feeling good about including horses in my life on a consistent basis.

I am a better mom for it.

And my kids understand life at a depth they wouldn't otherwise.

My kids understand passion.

They understand dogged, relentless, unapologetic pursuit.

They understand consistency, focus, and attention.

They understand the difference between an excited mama and a sad mama (who's not riding).

They understand animals. And devotion.

They understand what's at the heart of a dream.

And that we can go after dreams just because we want to.

They understand that we are ALL worthy.

And they understand what it means to believe in people.

Because they know how good it feels, how much it matters when someone believes in them.

And thus they advocate for themselves and their dreams.

See, by continuing to honor myself, I have honored my children.

Because I have honored my future, they honor theirs.

Because I honor my dream no matter what my age, they will see their own value no matter their age.

So yes - in the short term - it is WAY hard.

In fact it would be MUCH easier to quit.

MOST days I have WANTED to quit.

But there's always a whisper in the back of my mind or maybe in my heart - to show up anyway.

And on those precious perfect days, where everything goes right - then - I know it's been worth it.

So Mama - get yourself to the barn.

Get yourself in the saddle.

It is a compounding investment in yourself AND in your kids for the long-term.

And if you need permission to see it this way - I'm here to give it to you.

Just like someone gave it to me.

Now swing yourself up into the saddle (or use the mounting block).

But however you do it - make sure you're getting on.

For we are all better off when you're taking care of you.

FRC Scholarship Application

FRC is proud to be able to award four scholarships annually. In order to qualify for an FRC Scholarship, you must be a current FRC member at the time of your application. Additionally, your request must be for a rare educational opportunity or clinic or a championship competition purpose directly related to your riding discipline. In exchange, scholarship recipients must give back to the club in some tangible way.

Scholarships are for a maximum of \$250; four awarded yearly

- Scholarships for May, June, July events are due April 1st
- Scholarships for August, September, October events are due July 1st
- Scholarships for November, December, January events are due October 1st
- Scholarships for February, March, April events are due January 1st

If there are more than 4 applicants, volunteer service to the club in the current and preceding membership year will be taken into awarding scholarships.

Applicants will be notified of acceptance after review by the FRC Board.
