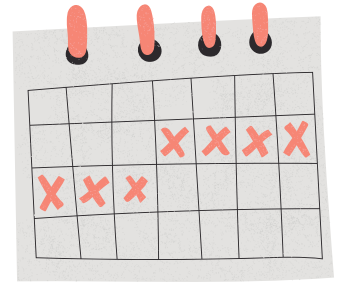

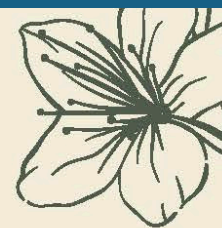

MY FAVORITE HORSE

Ever been to a horse sale “just to watch”? My husband and I did that in 1990 and ended up making two trailer trips from Maysville to Louisville, KY to bring home the three horses we purchased at a Paramount Arabians auction. Of the three horses, I resold one for more than I paid, and one became my daughter’s horse and then went on to good friends when she outgrew him. The third was a 4 year old Polish Arabian stallion by the name of Huntah who had been trained for the track but never raced because of a suspensory injury; he sold for \$500.

Huntah (now Hunter) had spent his life on groomed pastures or in a stall, so after he was gelded and I started riding him, he understandably would get very nervous about weeds touching his belly, low hanging branches, and horses passing either direction. He figured out rural riding pretty quickly though, and soon became the perfect long distance horse - willing, brave, all business on the trail, easy to load and haul, and a total gentleman around the barn and at ride camps. As a bonus he had a very competitive nature. Many times we were on trail alone, moseying along, and he would flick an ear back and take off, having heard horses coming up behind us. Even when mandatory holds were back at ride camp, he was always eager to leave his hay bag and take back off down the trail.

We joke about the saying “healthy as a horse” because we’ve all had to deal with so many equine health issues, but Hunter really was healthy up to the day he died at 31 years old, requiring no more than a yearly vet visit for his rabies shot and a Coggins test. We did struggle for a bit with a subtle lameness, and after a misdiagnosis of navicular and a visit to UGA the problem of sore heels was solved by using bar shoes during the competition season.

For conditioning and to get the hang of long distance competition, we logged close to 700 miles of competitive trail rides over two years. Then, beginning in 1994, we completed well over 3,000 miles of endurance rides of 50, 75 and 100 miles. In 2002 we won the Biltmore 50 against 108 starters.

My Favorite Horse

The following year we did our first 100 mile ride at the Biltmore, which gave me the distinction of coming in both first and last at a Biltmore ride! For a change of pace over the years, we threw in a ride and tie with my husband and a triathlon with my husband and brother-in-law.

For 27 years Hunter was my friend, companion, fellow explorer, and source of great pride and joy. Most importantly, my time with Hunter taught me so much about horses, myself, and life in general. I wasn't looking for a horse when we went to that sale, but I feel extraordinarily lucky to have had him in my life.

But young people grow up and need to start real life.

I was tickled to receive this update - especially in regard to the love and care he would receive as well as their commitment to keep him forever - even after his last riding chapter is done.

But this update reminded me of something I think about often when I'm bringing my horses along.

That the best service we can give any of our horses is to educate them.

Because an educated horse almost always ends up in a good home.

An educated horse is handled, appreciated, and loved because he has something valuable to offer his human.

And in return he receives care (often above and beyond the care most of us give ourselves).

So please - educate your horses.

Teach them respect.

Train them with future and perhaps less confident riders in mind.

Because at the end of the day an education is the most enduring gift you can impart to any horse.

This is how we do right by them.

Love them through training and education.

Then they will be loved for the rest of their lives - even if it's not in your barn.

FRC Scholarship Application

FRC is proud to be able to award four scholarships annually. In order to qualify for an FRC Scholarship, you must be a current FRC member at the time of your application. Additionally, your request must be for a rare educational opportunity or clinic or a championship competition purpose directly related to your riding discipline. In exchange, scholarship recipients must give back to the club in some tangible way.

Scholarships are for a maximum of \$250; four awarded yearly

- Scholarships for May, June, July events are due April 1st
- Scholarships for August, September, October events are due July 1st
- Scholarships for November, December, January events are due October 1st
- Scholarships for February, March, April events are due January 1st

If there are more than 4 applicants, volunteer service to the club in the current and preceding membership year will be taken into awarding scholarships.

Applicants will be notified of acceptance after review by the FRC Board.

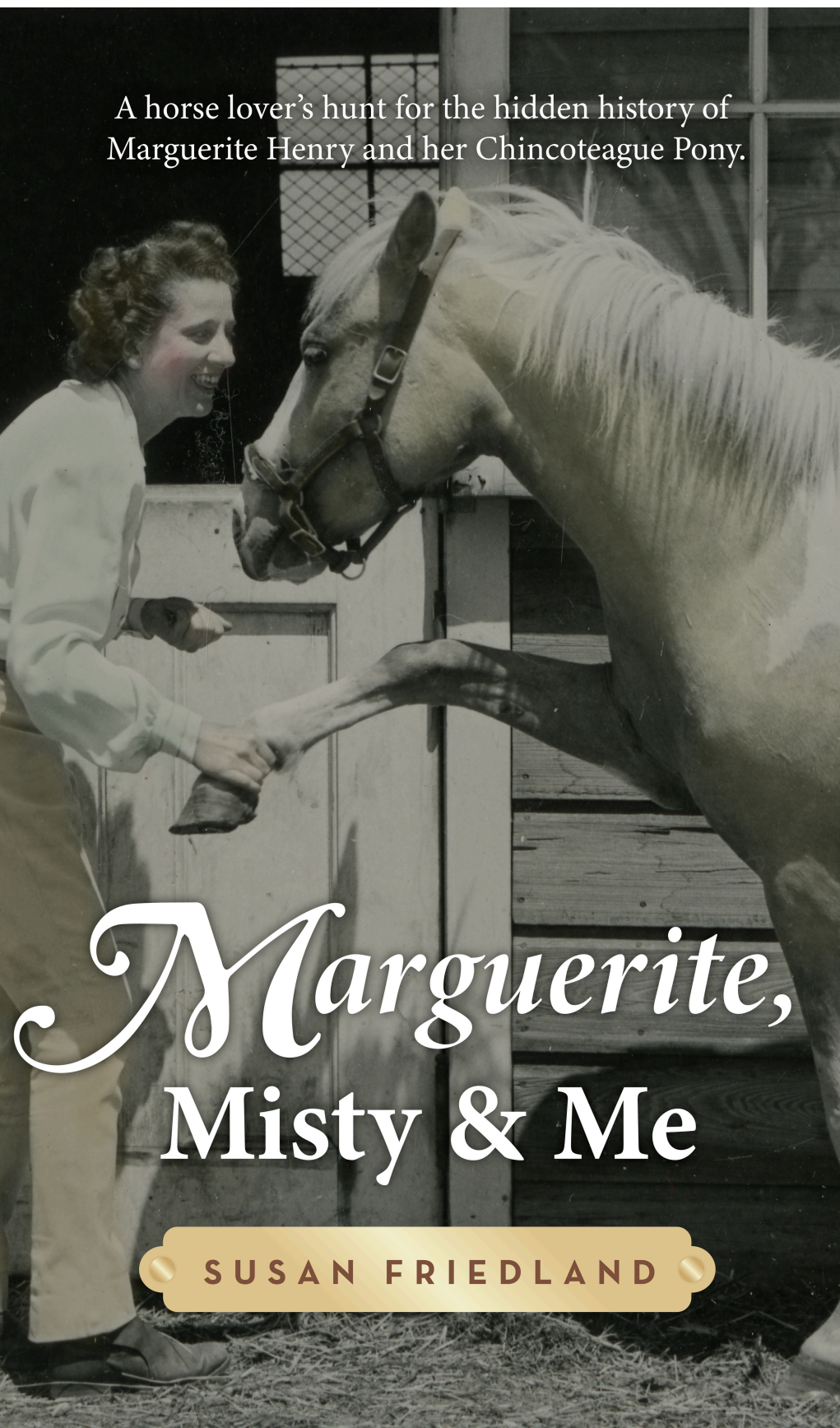

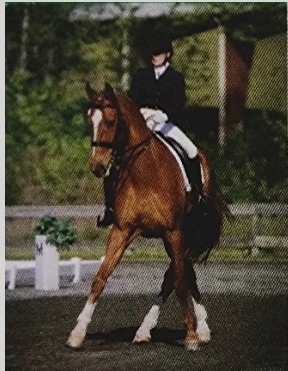
