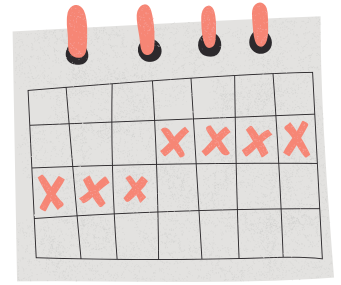

CENTER LINE (FORE)SIGHT

Most people watch dressage tests from the side of the ring or, of course, from the horse's back. Therefore, they don't see what the judge can clearly see, which is how obvious the geometry of test riding is in relation to the center line.

Since the judge is sitting right at C, any lack of precision relative to the center line is glaringly clear to her. This applies to the size of circles and also to the loops that go through X. Since the ring is 20 meters wide, 10-meter circles that start at C, for example, should touch the two quarter lines, but often they ooze out one side and become more like 13-meter ovals.

A 15-meter circle centered at C should touch spaces midway between the quarter lines and long sides, while one that starts at P would touch the quarter line on the opposite side. These spacings are apparent to someone sitting at C and, if they don't happen, then the judge may presume the horse is drifting out through the aids and is not in the rider's control.

Several tests have half 10-meter loops that go through X. A Second Level serpentine that starts at B and ends at E, for example, should have two equal-sized loops and not one that is 8 meters while the other one is 12 meters. The loops that run the length of the arena in trot for Training 3 or in counter canter for First 3 should go through X and not some vague region just past the quarter line.

One strategy to help you find this spacing can be to glance toward A or C to see if you are cutting the space too small or sliding too wide. With circle size, generally you're better off aiming a bit small, because horses tend to drift out, plus it's easier to leg yield out a couple meters but harder to make a large circle smaller once you're on an arc that starts too wide.

This concept of geometry relative to the center line starts with your first entrance at A in Intro A (was the turn at A too wide?!) and goes all the way to Grand Prix, where there is a canter zig-zag that might zig 3 meters one way and zag 7 meters the other. Finding the center line right at the start of your dressage journey will help earn you positive points the entire way.

Foothills Riding Club is holding a dressage fix-a-test clinic with Margaret Freeman on Saturday June 20 at Deer Meadow Farm.

The format will be a 40-minute segment for each rider. The rider will be warmed up and ride their test at the start of the segment. The rider will then work with Margaret on portions of the test where the test score can be improved. The rider has the option of repeating the test again at the end of the segment. The tests can be any USEF, USDF or FEI dressage test and will be held in the large arena.

Auditors are welcome, and there will be opportunities to ask questions.

Deer Meadow Farm has a covered arena. The address is [149 Caro Lane, Chesnee SC](#). It is located about 10 minutes from the intersection of US 26 (Exit 5) and SC 11 or 10 minutes from Green Creek.

Margaret has been judging dressage for 38 years and holds a “Senior” USEF license. In addition to judging and teaching, she’s active with youth dressage activities and specializes in showmanship clinics.

Cost for the clinic is \$65 for FRC members, \$85 for non-members, \$20 for auditors (one free additional auditor per horse; byo chair), and \$30 for a day stall.

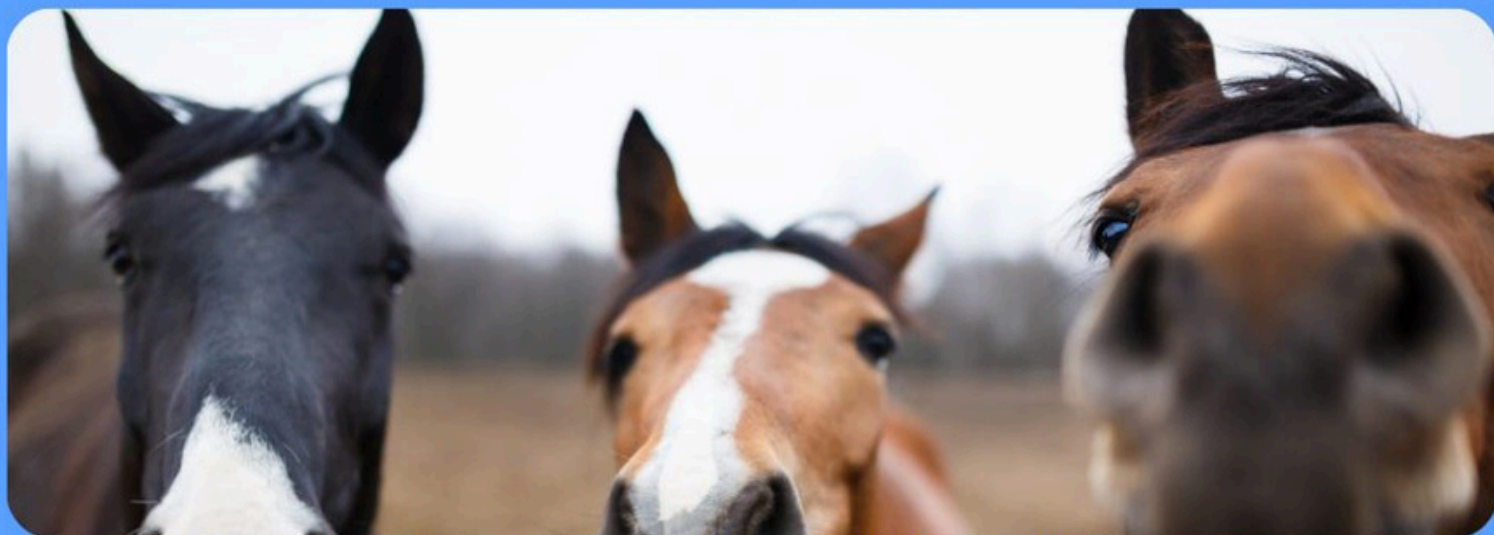

The presentation began with Libbie Johnson giving a history of Tryon Horse Country. She covered the very beginnings of our area, the influence of Carter Brown and Gordon Wright in the making of this area into a premier horse destination.

Next up was Larry Roselle, FETA President, who gave a detailed overview of the trails in the area and a brief recap on what is needed to keep the trails open.

Cassie LeMaster, Extension Agent for our area, continued the presentation with the pros and cons of the flora and fauna of the area and the joys of fescue grass!

The next presentation was done by veterinarian Dr. Bibi Freer, DVM who presented what we need to know about vaccinations, worming, feeding and things that appear here that you might not be familiar with in other areas—like the “slobbers”.

Next up was Margo Savage West who gave a quick outline of the equine organizations in the area and introduced the wonderful Animal Control officers who serve our area.

During the program FRC presented two special awards for “Outstanding Leadership and Contribution in Tryon Horse Country”. The first one was to Noreen Cothran Feagin for her years of supporting the horse industry and the second was to Libbie Johnson for her dedication to the horse industry. THIS YEAR'S EVENT HONORS OUTSTANDING LEADERS IN TRYON HORSE COUNTRY



For more than three decades, **Noreen Cothran Feagin** has been one of the most influential leaders in the growth and development of Tryon Horse Country. Through her leadership, vision, and unwavering commitment to the region, she has helped shape the equestrian landscape that riders, businesses, and organizations benefit from today. Noreen has always understood that strong communities are built through local support.

Beginning in 2000, she championed the **“Shop Local. It Matters”** campaign, encouraging equestrians and residents alike to support local businesses. Her advocacy extended far beyond her own business interests, reflecting her belief that a thriving equestrian community depends on a thriving local economy. She is monumental to who I am today. Also, Butch Kennedy, who was one of my most important mentors, has passed; and I am not sure where Ruth Paul is now. But they were also angels who were in my life helping me develop as a young professional. The trip has been long but the ride has been FUN!

FRC Scholarship Application

The Foothills Riding Club (FRC) offers up to 4 scholarships annually for current members, aimed at supporting specific educational or competitive opportunities (not for regular lessons or local shows, but for championship events).

Scholarships are announced in the newsletter and on social media. The Board will select the recipients and determine the scholarship amounts. To be eligible, applicants must have logged a minimum of 4.5 hours of volunteer time with FRC. Scholarship recipients are required to "payback" their award in some way, such as by writing an article for the newsletter, speaking at a monthly meeting, etc.

Each member is eligible for **one scholarship per year**.

Applications must be submitted at least **6 weeks before** the proposed event.

The scholarship award amounts are based on the number of volunteer hours logged with FRC:

- **4.5 hours** = \$250
- **9 hours (full day)** = \$500

A total of **\$2,000** is available each year, with a **\$500 cap** per scholarship recipient.

If there are more than 4 applicants, volunteer service to the club in the current and preceding membership year will be taken into awarding scholarships.

Applicants will be notified of acceptance after review by the FRC Board.

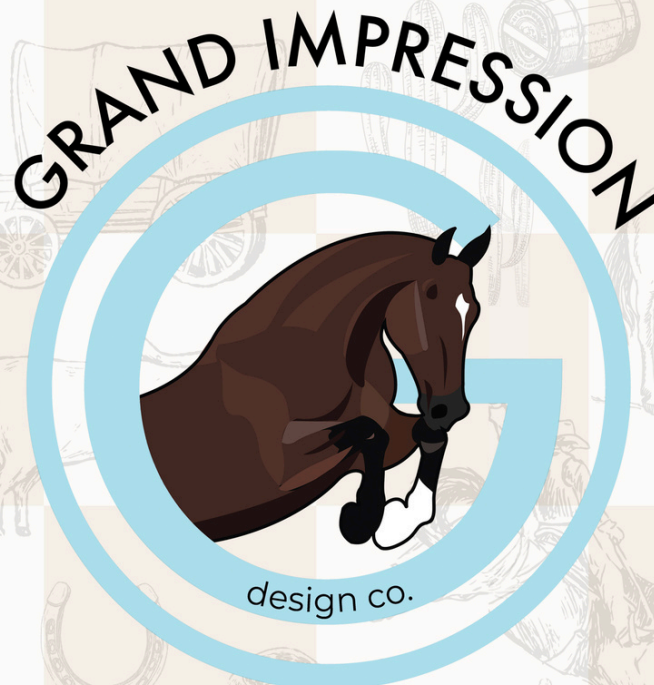



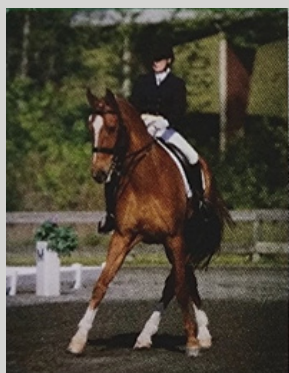
